REPORTS:

<u>Fire Dept:</u> V. Feldpausch stated 4 applications have been accepted for 2 openings now with another opening in November; department has introduced active 9-1-1 using cell phones as well as pagers for driving directions.

<u>Clerk:</u> T. Koenigsknecht worked on master cards; several hours with Patti Schafer closing year end; contacted Larry Cleaver reference additional zoning coverage with Master Plan in place; contacted legal counsel reference overlay of County's site plan procedure and working on FD Rescue Contracts. *A motion was made by V. Feldpausch, supported by S. Schafer to approve \$100 for a new paper shredder. Motion carried.*

<u>Treasurer:</u> G. Arens stated he is working on collecting taxes and has collected 22% of the taxes thus far; and disseminated a CD Investment and cash flow reports.

<u>Supervisor:</u> V. Feldpausch has been working with a farmer on a land split; Dan Arens has asked if our township hall could be used to work on a painting for the St. Johns Chamber of Commerce. Discussion followed and Board felt if the painting wasn't in the way of township business, he could use the hall for painting.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

1. <u>Wind Turbines:</u> Legal Counsel has forwarded appeal to Supreme Court.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. <u>Zoning Administrator's Report</u>: T. Foster's activity was one zoning question on a buildable lot and no permit questions.

2. <u>E-Tankers.com Legal Action</u>: V. Feldpausch informed the Board that legal counsel stated he could send a letter to E-Tankers.com or legal action could be started at a cost of between \$7000 - \$15,000. Clerk read email that was sent from supervisor to E-Tanker and also to legal counsel. Board directed supervisor to have legal counsel draw up a letter to E-Tanker.com.

3. <u>County Commissioners Report</u>: Commissioner Pohl stated County is moving forward with the southeast 9-1-1 tower; audit came back in good shape; pension is funded 94%, courthouse is paid off; 210 tons of recyclables & bulky waste went through the April CCE; new FOIA policy is in effect. Eaton, Ingham & Clinton County plus Delta approved FEMA standards; last board meeting discussion from Clinton Conservation District & MMDHD regarding water quality; Central Dispatch is purchasing computer aided dispatch interface & installation to assist with medical runs; and Child Care Fund is within budget.

4. <u>Amendment to Bengal & Lebanon Twp Rescue Contract – Refusal Fee:</u> There was discussion among the Board regarding medical refusal charges in the current contracts between Bengal & Lebanon Townships and Dallas Township Rescue. In an effort to clarify refusal billings, *a motion was made by G. Arens, supported by S. Schafer to amend both contract to include the \$125 refusal language that is in the current Rescue Ordinance. Motion carried.* Clerk will forward contracts to both townships for signatures.

5. <u>Clinton County Sheriff's Office:</u> Deputy Foerster reported that Dallas Township has been quiet the past few months.
